US Refiners' Crude Feed

The surge of crude oil production in North America has delivered unprecedented change on the US energy landscape. In 2013 alone, crude oil production in North America increased an approximately 1.4 million barrels per day, representing a 15% increase year-over-year. Most of the Crude produced in the lower 48 is light sweet, much of it ultra-light sweet.

This trend in production growth is anticipated to continue, giving rise to questions such as what does it mean to US imports and refiners? Bentek Energy will present its analysis on how US and Canadian production might impact North American historical trends of water borne imports into the US, and what the crude oil quality of this new production might mean to refiners. As production booms, can North America adequately grow its transportation and refining infrastructure rapidly enough to take advantage of this newly created domestic energy asset?
